NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairperson, to enter into the attached MOU Agreement and Non-Disclosure Agreement between the Batchewana First Nation and the Sault Tribe of Chippewa Indians.

Moved by Director McLeod, supported by Director Causley, to approve Res. 2020-28, Tamarack Business Center Authorization to Verify Supporting Documentation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Sault Tribe's EDC Executive Director, or his designee, to sign documents verifying the purpose, use, land status, and zoning of the Tamarack Business Center.

Moved by Director Gravelle, supported by Director McLeod, to approve Res. 2020-29, Authorization to Apply for a Grant from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Sault Tribe's EDC Executive Director, to apply to the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, for a grant of up to \$80,000, for the purpose of obtaining strategic consultation and training services to move the Sault Tribe Inc. initiative forward.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairperson, or his designee, to sign, negotiate, amend, execute and accept any agreement and grant funding of up to \$80,000.00, if awarded, from the MEDC for this purpose.

Moved by Director Sorenson, supported by Director Massaway, to approve Res. 2020-30, Authorization to Apply for a Grant from the Economic Development Agency (EDA).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Sault Tribe's EDC Executive Director, to apply to the Economic Development Agency, for a grant of up to \$300,000.00, for the purpose of assessing economic development opportunities for existing lands and develop a plan to move forward with such plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the grant application includes the Eastern Upper Peninsula Regional Planning as a joint applicant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors, hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairperson, to sign, negotiate, amend, execute and accept any agreement and grant funding of up to \$300,000.00, if awarded, from the EDA, for the production of a strategy plan, that accomplishes three goals: a plan that highlights feasible economic development possibilities for the Tribe, both on and off the Reservation (Phase I); creates a community land use plan for existing land owned by the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians (Phase II); and, determines a land acquisition plan for the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians (Phase III).

Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Chase, supported by Director Morrow, to approve Res. 2020-32, Sault Tribe Comprehensive Classification & Compensation Study Project #19-053 Contract Award & Budget Authorization.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors hereby authorizes the selection and contracting with MGT Consulting Group, to perform a classification and compensation study of the governmental, enterprise and gaming positions, as outlined in the Request for Proposal (RFP) for the Sault Tribe Comprehensive Classification and Compensation Study Project # 19-053 dated 09/13/19, and authorizes the Chairperson to sign and execute all documentation to facilitate this agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors authorizes total funding of \$270,460.00 to complete the Comprehensive Classification and Compensation Study Project # 19-053 from Human Resources, Cost Center #8551.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairperson or his designee, is authorized to negotiate and execute a retainer agreement to effectuate the forgoing on terms he deems to be in the Tribe's best interest.
