WHEREAS, IHS is providing \$256,000 for sewer lateral rehabilitation to serve existing category homes to protect the health of the Tribal members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe has reviewed and concurs with the provisions of the attached Memorandum of Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians (the "Tribe") is organized pursuant to the Constitution of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians and the Sault Ste. Marie Board of Directors is the governing body of the Tribe pursuant to the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, Article IV, Section 1; and

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Board of Directors is vested with enumerated powers in Article VII of the Constitution, including to manage any and all economic affairs and enterprises of the tribe and to engage in any business not contrary to Federal law that will further the economic development of the tribe or its members, and to use the tribal funds or other tribal resources for such purposes pursuant to Section 1(m); and

WHEREAS, the Sault Tribe Youth Facility is a Tribal detention facility located on Tribal Trust lands and operated through a Self-Governance Compact with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) in accordance with the BIA Division of Operations Corrections Policies; and

WHEREAS, the BIA has determined the facility is in compliance with all applicable federal laws and regulations and the Tribe desires to issue a license to the Sault Tribe Youth Facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby issues a facility license, attached and incorporated herein by this reference, for the Sault Tribe Youth Facility to operate within the boundaries of the Tribe.

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AMENDING CHAPTER 90: HOUSING AUTHORITY ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians ("Tribe") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, as amended; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 P.L. 104-330, 25 U.S.C. 4101 et.seq., required Tribal Governments to select an entity to receive grant amounts and provide assistance under the Act for affordable housing for Indians; and

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians are dedicated to the furtherance of the principles of Indian Self-Determination as emulated in the Indian Self-Determination Educations and Assistance Act P.L. 93-638, as amended, and the provisions of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act; and

WHEREAS, under resolution 1998-66 the Sault Tribe Housing Authority was established as a Tribally Designated Housing Entity for recipient of funds from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 90.505 says the Authority shall not construct or operate any project for profit; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe would like to grant the Housing Authority the ability to operate any housing related community development projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby amends Tribal Code Chapter 90: Housing Authority Ordinance as follows:

90.505 Projects

The Authority shall have the ability to construct or operate any project that would qualify as a housing related community development.

- 1) The terms housing related community development mean any facility, community building, business, activity, or infrastructure that:
 - a) Is owned by an Indian tribe or a tribally designated housing entity;
 - b) Is necessary to the provision of housing in an Indian area; and
